THANK YOU FOR YOUR GENEROSITY! Thank you to all who donated close to \$5,000 on two Sundays in March to help the people of Ukraine! Half of these donations will be directed to the Connecticut Institute of Refugees and Immigrants (CIRI) to support Ukrainian refugees who will be resettled in Connecticut. The other half has been used to purchase medical supplies for hospitals in and around the city of Lviv, Ukraine, and for non-perishable food items such as energy bars. SCC's medical supply donations and food items will be delivered to St. Michael the Archangel Parish in the Bridgeport Diocese, and the container will be shipped on April 1 to Cracow, Poland. From there, the supplies will travel via Franciscan Ways to Lviv.
