# WE ARE REPOINTING THE EXTERIOR OF OUR CHURCH! PATIENCE WILL CERTAINLY BE A VIRTUE! On Tuesday, May 10, our contractor will start repointing the exterior stone of our historical church building. Repointing is the removal and replacement of the joint mortar that binds the stones together. About 50% of our church exterior is compromised and needs this work. The project has been in the planning stages with Buildings & Grounds and Trustees for several years. Our hope is the repointing will help keep our beautiful church building structurally sound for many generations to come! The work will take about three months to complete and will impact driveway and parking lot flow at times, especially along the exit driveway. When work is being done on the back and driveway exit sides of the building, there will be periods when we will need to block off the exit driveway and create two lane traffic for the entrance driveway. We will try to coordinate this work for times when there is the least amount of church activity (services, Preschool, Broadway Boot Camp, The Carousel), but there will be periods when logistically it is not feasible. Your understanding and patience with changing driveway and parking lot traffic patterns will be most appreciated!
